Later, it was found that the product that can use the sun to generate electricity is called off grid solar power system, which uses the solar heat energy to convert into electric energy, without high maintenance costs, and is a green and quiet power generation product.

Officially opened in 1962, the Richmond Hydropower Plant was built to facilitate the expansion of electricity to rural areas in St. Vincent. This run of river plant houses two Turgo impulse turbine generator units of 550 kW output each. The station has a nominal capacity of 1100kW.
